Data Privacy

Your Rights Under Minnesota Data Practices Act and Data Privacy Rules

Federal and State laws require this agency:

- To protect your privacy and protected health information.
- to let you see the information we have about you.
- To explain our need for and use of information about you.
- To explain your rights regarding this information.
- To provide you with notices of our legal duties and privacy practices concerning protected health information.

Privacy

Most of the information we collect about you will be classified as private. That means you and the government agencies who need the information can see it: others cannot. Occasionally statistics and other anonymous data will be taken from the information we collect about you. This is public and open to anyone, but will not identify you in any way.

On rare occasions, information we collect is classified confidential. Confidential data is not open to anyone (not even to you) except the government agencies that need it. Data in this category deals with adoption, civil or criminal investigations, some medical data, and the names of persons who report child or vulnerable adult abuse.

South Central Human Relations is required to abide by terms of the Privacy Notice currently in effect and reserve the right to change the terms of the notice and make new provisions effective for all protected health information. Revised notices are available upon request.
